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This year we have made a change in the technology that we use to monitor students' reading ages, during their fortnightly library based reading lessons. These lessons now involve students engaging with the Bedrock system which guides them through a selection of texts, vocabulary and grammar based exercises.



Bedrock teaches Tier 2 vocabulary (high-frequency, challenging words), as well as subjectspecific Tier 3 vocabulary (words relating to a particular topic) by exposing students to a range of fiction and non-fiction texts. The curriculum is personalised for each learner and takes them on a learning journey appropriate to their ability and knowledge. The system automatically generates and assigns learning content to students, marks the work produced and delivers personalised content based on results.

A wealth of research finds that vocabulary and grammar are learned best in the context of rich, authentic (genuine, real-life) texts. By reading such texts on Bedrock, students grow their cultural capital and understanding of the world from the wide selection of topics on offer.

This is a change from the Accelerated Reader platform we used previously and; we have invested in new tablets and headsets to ensure that students have the best experience in their library lessons to engage with such a fantastic platform.

As a school, we are incredibly proud of our students for their engagement with Bedrock. A special congratulations to the students below for their incredible effort and progress on Bedrock this academic year!

READING AT MARSHALLS PARK

As a school, we passionately believe in the power of reading; reading a wide range of texts can expand horizons and develop our learners into globally aware citizens. As such, we have established a Period 6 reading canon for KS3 and utilise the online platform Bedrock to support students' literacy and vocabulary.

MPA Literary Canon

In Period 6 sessions, KS3 students are exposed to the MPA reading canon, a list of fiction texts that cover a range of diverse texts of literary merit. The ability to read and comprehend is vital at GCSE, as the reading ages of the GCSE papers across all subjects are high. Research has shown that reading fluency can be addressed through reading aloud, hence the Period 6 reading sessions where tutors model reading to students. We hope that students engage with reading and take the opportunity to visit the library regularly to see what other books there are that could capture their interests, based on the current book they are reading in form.

Brilliant Club

At Marshalls we are proud to work with the Brilliant Club who run the Scholars Programme which supports students who are less advantaged to access the most competitive universities and succeed when they get there. The programme targets students who are least likely to access the most competitive universities because of their background. In a nutshell, creating a world in which everyone has a fair chance to access the life-changing opportunities that come with attending a competitive university. One may ask how this happens? It is through the tutorials, students experience universitystyle learning and completing a challenging final assignment to build the knowledge, skills and confidence needed to progress to university. The programme also includes two trips to universities, so students can learn about university life. On completion of the programme, students will visit a university for a Graduation Event to celebrate their achievements and build their understanding of higher education, helping them make informed choices in the future and believe that they can succeed in university-style learning. The Scholars Programme is rigorous and robust. At Marshalls we are also able to track the outcomes of our students, whilst also focusing on key skills that support academic achievement and university preparedness. These include written communication, subject knowledge, critical thinking, and university selfefficacy.

The feedback from our students involved demonstrates the impact the programme is already having on them.

One of our students said: "I am so glad I am on this programme." Another student said, "I wish we could have it every day because so far, I have learnt a few things on sustainability in buildings. Looking forward to more!" A third student articulated our Brilliant Club as "opportunities to discover and learn about topics we wouldn't normally come across in our usual lessons." Some of our students are shown during a session. As we journey, we will have more exciting news to inform all our readers.















Student Achievements

CYCLE CONFIDENT

During the penultimate week in January a group a group of six students from Year 7 and 8, who are regular bike riders, took park in a Cycle Confident course in order to ensure they are as safe as possible when riding to and from school.

Over the week the students had the opportunity to develop good habits when riding alongside other cyclists, as well as a greater awareness of how to navigate more complex roads. This included experiencing busier roads, more complicated junctions, and faster roads with speed limits above 30mph.

The instructors were impressed with how well the group progressed throughout the week, becoming more confident with how to handle junctions controlled by traffic lights, multi-lane roads and cycle lanes. They also developed increasing competence in being able to read the road and respond safely when a situation changes quickly, for example, when a vehicle pulls out in front of you unexpectedly.

As a result of this our students covered a lot of the borough on the bikes, clocking up an impressive 15 miles in one day alone! Well done to all involved.



FUTURECHEF

Armaan Mhatey (year 9) represented Marshalls Park at the FutureChef semi-final last week.
